Whilst my (older, before you ask) brother conducted the band for that concert, it was also where my conducting journey started with this band, as I got to conduct one piece ("Neil Diamond In Concert") as I was more of an expert in all things Mr Diamond.

After a short break in the 1990s to enable the band to rebuild after the loss of Sid, I was very happy to bring the band back here for a concert in February 2000, and other than Covid years we have played here at least once every year since. The reason we keep coming back is simple - we are blessed with an audience who make playing here so much fun.

Thanks again for coming along today and helping us raise money for the Tom Bowdidge Youth Cancer Foundation, and we hope you enjoy the concert.
